<p><b>●Goals of the Course</b>            What is gender? This class will examine society from three perspectives: women's studies, men's studies, and sexuality studies. Women's studies reexamine existing male-dominated scholarship and systems from women's perspectives. Men's studies shed light on gender-related experiences of men. Sexuality studies respect sexual diversity and focus on the mind of the subject. We will consider the importance of gender equality to create a society where people can shine regardless of gender and analyze various issues such as politics, economics, education, media, marriage, and the declining birthrate through gender perspectives.</p> <p>This class will be taught by three instructors. Mayumi Saegusa will focus on women's perspectives, Ryo Kawaguchi will provide lectures on masculinities, and Naoto Machida will shed light on sexuality studies. This class will be conducted mainly through lectures, but there will also be times for active learning through group work.</p>
